

- 76 Registered Runners, 73 Starters, 66 Finishers.
- 29 starters had never run 50 miles before. 27 of them finished.
- Gang, gang, the hail's all here: Le Grizz veterans who thought they'd seen it all were pelted with a generous shower of hailstones at 40 miles. The falling ice turned the road white and provided a cool springy running surface on what is usually a stiff part of the course. Sleet, wind, rain, mud and teasing sun also enhanced the enjoyment of the event.
- The Special Olympics did it's now-proficient job of manning an aid station and cheering section on the dam at 47 miles. Plum Creek Timber Company donated them \$1700.00 on behalf of all the finishers.
- Runners from 14 states and 2 Canadian provinces participated this year.
- The overall winner was Rick Spady. He has now won five times out of nine and still holds the course record of 5:44:54.
- The first lady in was Bobbie Dixon for the seventh time. Bobbie has always won her division, and still holds the women's course record of 6:37:53.
- Women's Open Division winner was Lorraine Lees-McGeough. She was the first Canadian woman to take home a Le Grizz trophy.
- Fred Braden took the men's masters trophy in his first 50 miler. Fred ran a 2:52 marathon this year, and his longest training run was 29 miles.
- Stuart White missed catching Fred by less than a minute, despite being behind by 14 minutes at 40 miles. Stuart improved over his effort last year by 43 minutes.
- Other notable Le Grizz PR's were posted by Randy Sheffer (54 minutes faster), Steve Peterson (48 minutes), Kim Warner (41 minutes), Manuel Lopez (40 minutes), Margaret Smith (37 minutes), Mike Rembolt (24 minutes) and Kevin Olive (20 minutes).
- Tough Break Department: The inclement weather, and the upgrade on the short trail near the finish line took its toll on Jenny Mitchell, who finished two seconds slower than last year.
- Next year will be the tenth running of Le Grizz, and will likely mark the presentation of a trophy unique in ultrarunning circles, the "10 Bears" award. This special recognition, which along with 50¢ will buy a cup of coffee, is to go to any runner who successfully completes 10 Le Grizz runs. Steve Heaps and Bobbie Dixon both have nine finishes, Rick Spady has eight, and Jim Pomroy, Doug Clark, Larry Carroll and Mike Schmahl each have seven. If Dixon & Heaps finish next year, it will be ten finishes IN A ROW for each of them.
- "Runner with poorly planned E.T.A. due to the most noticeable major malfunction" was engraved on this year's special recognition, the "A.S.A.F.P. Award," which went to Mark Tarr and Betty Stone for their extra efforts in getting to the finish line A.S.A.P.(as soon as possible).

-- The course change worked out well in terms of finish line management. Several runners commented on the violent nature of the gradient on the lakeside trail. The course change will likely become a permanent feature of Le Grizz, as there is no steeper trail that could easily be incorporated into the course.
